



Equipment • Around the Island Canoe Trip 2024

If you are staying for the camp week at Emerald Bay, you should pack two bags, a duffel bag for your camp gear plus a waterproof dry bag (50-60 liters) for the canoe trip. The duffel bag will be stored at Camp Emerald Bay until we return.

Adults returning home immediately after the canoe trip will probably need just the dry bag with your canoeing gear.

TENT. No tent is required, but a small one-man backpacking tent or shared tent is OK (in the past, some people have experienced creepy, crawling critters at night without a tent).

SLEEPING BAG. Sleeping bag liner or lightweight bag/sheet (40-60°) will be sufficient and less bulky than a warm sleeping bag.

Complete Scout uniform is required for Scouts for the trip to Emerald Bay.
Bring a lunch and snacks--the first meal served at camp is Friday dinner.

WEAR (OR CARRY) ON CANOE TRIP

- swim trunks and/or nylon pants for canoeing
- T-shirt and/or long-sleeve nylon shirt for canoeing
- canoeing shoes, socks
- hat with 360° brim and chin strap
- gloves and/or sports tape to protect from blisters
- sunglasses with strap
- sunscreen (bring a lot with high SPF)
- chapstick/lip balm
- water bottle with cord to tie onto canoe
- seasickness medication (if needed)

TAKE ON CANOE TRIP IN WATERPROOF DRY BAG

- small one-man or shared tent (optional--see above)
- groundcloth (optional)
- sleeping pad
- sleeping bag (see above)
- light jacket or sweater
- small toilet kit with toothpaste, toothbrush
- small personal first aid kit
- medications (if needed)
- small flashlight
- small towel
- change of clothes, dry shoes and socks for Avalon (and return home for those returning immediately after the trip)
- money for dinner in Avalon (also a few quarters for showers)
