

Equipment • Around the Island Canoe Trip 2024

If you are staying for the camp week at Emerald Bay, you should pack two bags, a duffel bag for your camp gear plus a waterproof dry bag (50-60 liters) for the canoe trip. The duffle bag will be stored at Camp Emerald Bay until we return.

Adults returning home immediately after the canoe trip will probably need just the dry bag with your canoeing gear.

TENT. No tent is required, but a small one-man backpacking tent or shared tent is OK (in the past, some people have experienced creepy, crawling critters at night without a tent).

SLEEPING BAG. Sleeping bag liner or lightweight bag/sheet (40-60°) will be sufficient and less bulky than a warm sleeping bag.

Complete Scout uniform is required for Scouts for the trip to Emerald Bay. Bring a lunch and snacks--the first meal served at camp is Friday dinner.
