Scouts who are not paddling around Catalina will check in at San Pedro terminal, The Battleship USS Iowa, Berth 87, at 6:30 a.m. on Sunday, July 28.

DIRECTIONS TO BERTH 87, San Pedro:

From I-405, take exit 37 to merge onto I-110 S toward San Pedro. Take exit 1A to merge onto CA-47 N toward Vincent Thomas Bridge/Terminal Island/Long Beach (do not go over the bridge). Take the South Harbor Blvd exit, continue onto S. Harbor Blvd. Proceed to The Battleship Iowa parking lot. Walk west past the Fire Department to find T2 meeting area near Berth 85; don't be late.

Don't eat a heavy/greasy breakfast since ferry ride is on the open ocean. Possibly take seasick medicine before boarding. Lunch is provided in camp on Sunday.

All Emerald Bay campers will return to the San Pedro terminal described above between 10:00 and 11:30 a.m. on Saturday, August 3. We will try to send an email via Messenger Dave with a better ETA.

The camp advises that mail sent after 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday may not arrive until after the Scouts have left camp.

An equipment list is printed below. Every item on the list is important, unless it is identified as "optional". Your name should be printed on EVERYTHING in indelible ink (especially scout pants and neckerchief can easily be lost).

No wifi is available for scouts at camp and cell coverage is not likely; scouts are asked to leave their cell phones and other electronics at home. The camp will confiscate any phones being used during instruction hours or inappropriately.

If you are paddling around the island, some of these items will be packed in your separate dry bag for that trip (see that list). Otherwise, everything should be in a duffel bag (max 50 lb); NO roller bags or external frame backpacks are allowed. Bags will be piled together and tossed down human chains, so carry breakables with you. Your bag should have your name and Troop 2- WLA printed boldly on the outside (e.g., on duct tape) so it can be identified in the pile.

We are suggesting \$50-\$80 (small bills) for wood slide to carve, supplies, souvenirs, and snacks. A parent leader can hold money for Scouts if desired.
